HOME FIRE SPRINKLERS

JANUARY Calendar Contest Topic Material

The month of January, in our Annual Fire & Life Safety Calendar, is dedicated to the importance of having home fire sprinklers. We need your 3rd grade students to help spread the word with their talents and knowledge!

- Home fire sprinklers can save lives and property from fire.
- They respond quickly and effectively to fire, often extinguishing the fire before the fire department arrives.
- Fire departments typically use roughly 10 times as much water as a fire sprinkler would use to contain a fire.

MYTH: "When a fire occurs, every sprinkler will activate and everything in the house will be ruined."

FACT: In the event of a fire, only the sprinkler closest to the fire will activate, spraying water directly on the fire, leaving the rest of the house dry and secure. Roughly 85 percent of the time, just one sprinkler head operates.
